Dual Credit Programs Offer a Head Start in Career Preparation and Exploration









Upon completing the Health Care Aide dual-credit program through Northern Lakes College, this Paul Rowe student will earn up to 36 high school CTS credits plus her HCA certification.

Peace River School Division has developed partnerships with Northern Lakes College, Olds, College, and NorthWestern Polytechnic to offer our high school students an opportunity to take university or college courses in their areas of interest for future careers, while still attending high school.

Dual Credit programs offer students the opportunity to take university and college accredited courses that can lead to post-secondary certification, while still in high school, and earn credits towards their high school diploma at the same time. At the school level, we work with the institution and instructors to

help plan and schedule to accommodate these courses within the student's high school time table.

There are many opportunities each semester including courses in:





ROYAL CANADIAN LEGION POSTER & LITERARY CONTEST








Thank you to all of the students who created original art and literature in honour of Remembrance Day.




ACADEMICS
